Notes

Arkansas

For those marked "yes," we reimburse actual expenses to AMA meeting (Annual Interim). Also, president, president-elect and Board of Trustees chair get expenses to AMA Advocacy Meeting.

Connecticut

*Flat honorarium of \$25,000 plus a per diem of \$750 once certain conditions are met on a quarterly basis as approved by executive director with quarterly review by fiscal subcommittee, not to exceed \$75,000 in any one year. Was instituted because we lost our president-elect to cancer and bylaws were a mess and president had to serve two years in a row.

*All Council members receive \$200 per council (board) meeting...six meetings per year.

*All AMA delegates get \$200 for each day of AMA/CSMS activity.

Delaware

Committee chair is specifically the Physicians' Health

Illinois

Trustees and officers are covered by a business travel and accident policy with a \$200,000 limit.

Indiana

Also pay honorarium of \$4,637 and travel expenses for the chair, Executive Committee.

Maine

Most of president's honorarium is used for expenses, summer meeting, President's Reception, etc.

Maryland

We have honoraria only for the current president and only last year raised from \$18,000 to \$25,000.

Michigan

AMA delegates and alternates covered for Annual, Interim and Leadership Conferences.

Minnesota

All mileage is reimbursed.

Missouri

All AMA delegates get transportation costs, basic hotel costs and \$75/day.

Montana

AMA Annual & Interim for Pres., Pres. Elect, Delegates, Alt. Delegates each allowed \$100 Per Diem, hotel and air (coach)

Nebraska

Pay all travel expenses for meeting we ask them to attend. Pay mileage to all board members for board meetings.

Ohio

Note 1 - The OSMA sends a large group of physicians to the AMA's Annual Meeting. Total AMA delegation physician expense accounts are budgeted at \$77,200 annually.

Note 2 - The PAC chairperson does not have a separate budget. The travel budget for the PAC committee is \$5,000 annually. The PAC has a budget of \$27,000 for all other expenses and functions.

Note 3 - Committee chairpersons do not have separate budgets. They are combined with other Council expenses. Total other council expenses of \$153,870 were budgeted for 2007.

South Dakota

We also provide travel for our VP to the AMA Advocacy Conference.
